Umer Khan is a serving Chief Inspector with Greater Manchester Police.

Umer joined GMP In August 1995, where he served as a constable on the Rochdale Division. He continued his service and personal development with postings in the CID, The Cheque Fraud and the Commercial Fraud Unit, followed by a deployment with HM Customs and Excise Covert Operations.

During the Northern Riots he was deployed as a Sergeant in the Oldham Borough, where he helped implement Neighbourhood Policing and improve Cohesion post the Northern Riots.

From 2009 Umer has worked as a Police Inspector in the Rochdale Borough, taking on various operational responsibilities; he was recognised for his leadership in helping maintain law and order during number of high profile protests.

In 2014 Umer took on the responsibility of Borough Chief Inspector before taking on a secondment to the GMP Neighbourhoods Confidence Equality Team, where he took responsibility for number of key areas, developing links with key partners and communities , improving engagement, cohesion and addressing key concerns of local communities and also leads on the community led 'We Stand Together' Cohesion campaign, which has now become a Nationally recognised response to Hate and intolerance. Umer is passionate about improving relations between communities, developing peace and unity through dialogue and understanding. Presently Umer is Operational Lead for Policing of North Manchester District

Outside of work his hobbies include volunteering and charity work. He coaches and mentors young people, two young people from his coaching group have gone on to acquire professional contracts at Lancashire County Cricket Club and play for England. He also supports various charities, helping support street children around the world.
